Mini Beasts Workshop

This two hour workshop is suitable for KS1 pupils studying habitats and environments and the wildlife found within them, as part of the Life Processes section of the science curriculum. It is also suitable for students investigating environmental sustainability as part of the geography curriculum.

The workshop takes place at Upton Country Park using resources provided by Poole Museum. The class will be split into two halves and carry out designated activities for one hour before swapping over. A member of the museum learning team will deliver activities with one half while the class teacher can carry out any number of activities from the self-directed study pack.

The workshop will begin at 10:00 am or 12:30pm, depending on your preference.

Learning Outcomes

1. To find out about different habitats and the wildlife found within them
2. To learn how to carry out safe environmental investigations
3. To understand the need to manage habitats successfully

Timetable

Group 1: Activity 1 - Minibeasts (30 minutes): using environmental methods to collect and observe minibeasts. Using magnifying glasses, magnification pots and pooters.

Activity 2 - Pond dipping (30 minutes): pond dipping with nets to examine the wildlife found within a pond. Using the nets in a safe manner and examining animals in an observation tray.

Group 2: Choose activities from wildlife and habitat scavenger hunts, trails, worksheets and games. All options will be provided, with full instructions, in the self-guided study pack. An idea of the time to spend on each chosen activity will be indicated on the instruction sheet. (60 minutes).
